7 Funds are appropriated by the Legislature 8 nursing home beds based on a demonstrated need. 9 Frequently, beds have not become available 10 scheduled because of delays in construction or because of lengthy appeals. Also, beds are remaining unfilled because of staffing shortages in some parts of the 11 12 13 State. This bill requires a quarterly review 14 intermediate care facility funds and requires that any 15 surplus over \$500,000, because either beds are not available or are not filled, be transferred to 16 17 Long-Term Care Account to serve eligible individuals

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
