5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 6 follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1471-M, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

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4. Assistance to agricultural employers. The Board of Pesticides Control, upon request, shall provide assistance to employers regulated by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources in the development and conduct of training programs for employees with respect to hazardous chemicals which are pesticides and in satisfying the information requirements of the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration's Hazard Communication Standard and the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of 1986, Public Law 99-499.

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- Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §61, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1987, c. 559, Pt. B, §8, is amended to read:
- 16 Source of funds. The commissioner annually assess a levy based on actual annual workers' 17 compensation paid losses, excluding medical payments, 18 19 paid in the previous calendar year by employers under 20 Title 39, the Workers' Compensation Act. As soon as 21 year, practicable after July lst of each 22 commissioner shall assess upon and collect from each 23 insurance carrier licensed to do workers' compensation business in the State, and each group and individual 24 25 self-insured employer authorized to make workers' 26 compensation payments directly to their employees, a sum equal to that proportion of the current fiscal year's appropriation, exclusive of any federal funds, for the safety education and training division which 27 28 29 the total workers' compensation benefits, exclusive of medical payments, paid by each carrier or each group or individual self-insured employer, bear to the total 30 31 32 33 benefits paid by all carriers, and group 34 individual self-insured employers, during the previous calendar year, except that the total amount levied annually may not exceed 1% of the total of the 35 36 37 compensation benefits paid by all carriers, and group 38 individual self-insured employers during under 39 previous calendar year. Assessments this section shall include sufficient funds to provide 40 41 \$40,000 for training and information activities 42 conducted by the Board of Pesticides Control.

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This bill is a result of a study of pesticide 1 Joint Standing Committee regulation by the Recent changes in federal regulations 3 Agriculture. 4 under the United States Environmental Protection Agency the Occupational Safety and Health and Administration will require additional reporting and 6 training to be conducted by employers where pesticides 7 are present. The bill provides funds to establish a 8 9 position in the Board of Pesticides Control

10 to provide employers, on request, person assistance in complying with the federal Occupational 11 Administration's 12 Safety and Health 13 . Standard Communication and the United States 14 Environmental Protection Agency's Community Right-to-Know Act insofar as they apply to pesticides.

This bill would result in an increase in dedicated revenue to the Safety Education and Training Fund in the amount of \$40,000 for fiscal year 1988-89. This estimated revenue would be derived from the proposed increase in the annual assessment of participating insurance carriers and self-insured employers.

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
