STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Deorganization of Town of Sherman. The Town of Sherman in Aroostook County is deorganized, provided that the corporate existence, powers, duties and liabilities of the town shall survive for the purposes of prosecuting and defending all pending

suits to which the town is, or may be, a party and all needful process arising out of such suits, including provisions for the payment of all or any judgments or debts which may be rendered against the town or exist in favor of any creditor.

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6 Sec. 2. Unexpended school funds. The treasurer of the town or any other person who has custody of the funds of the town shall pay to the Treasurer of State all unexpended school funds, which, together with the 7 8 ě 10 credits due the town for school purposes, are to be 11 used by the State Tax Assessor to settle any school 1.2 obligations contracted the by town 13 deorganization. Any unexpended school funds remaining 14 with the Treasurer of State after all the obligations have been met shall be added to the Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund, as established 15 16 17 in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, chapter 115.

18 3. Referendum; certificate to Secretary of The selectmen of the town shall submit this 19 Act to the legal voters of the Town of Sherman, by 20 ballot at the next general election in the month of November following the passage of this Act. This election shall be called, advertised and conducted 21 22 23 24 according to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 2061 and 2065. The town clerk shall prepare the required ballots, on which he shall reduce the 25 26 27 subject matter of this Aot to the following question:

"Shall the Town of Sherman be deorganized?"

The voters shall indicate their opinion on this question by a cross or check mark placed against the word "Yes" or "No." Before becoming effective, this Act must be approved by a majority of the legal voters voting at the general election, and the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act at the election must equal or exceed 50% of the total number of votes cast in the town for Governor at the last gubernatorial election.

The board of selectmen of the Town of Sherman see shall declare the result of the vote. The town clerk shall file a certificate of the election result with
