charter of the Anson Academy Association; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 11 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 12 Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the 13 14 15 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 16 now, therefore,
