#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Expand the Membership and Clarify the Role of the Commission on Intergovernmental Relations.

5 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the 6 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days 7 after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

8 Whereas, federal cuts have increased the 9 responsibility of state, municipal and county

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1 governments; and

2 Whereas, these government representatives need a 3 forum for developing programs and plans of mutual 4 benefit; and

5 Whereas, the Commission on Intergovernmental 6 Relations has not met for the past 4 years; and

7 Whereas, the Commission on Intergovernmental 8 Relations can provide the forum for discussion and 9 development of long-range goals and plans for state, 10 local and county government and enhance a spirit of 11 cooperation; and

12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 13 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 14 Constitution of Maine and require the following 15 legislation as immediately necessary for the 16 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 17 now, therefore,

18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 19 follows:

20 Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §271, as amended by PL 1983, c. 21 812, §7, is repealed and the following enacted in its 22 place:

## 23 §271. Establishment of commission

24	The Commission on Intergovernmental Relations, as
25	established by Title 5, chapter 379, shall be composed
26	of 17 regular members. The Governor shall appoint 2
27	representatives of county government and 2
28	representatives of municipal government. The
29	remaining members shall be appointed jointly by the
30	President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
31	as follows: Five members of the Legislature; 3
32	representatives of county government; 3
33	representatives of municipal government; one
34	representative of the Maine Municipal Association; one
35	representative of the Maine County Commissioners
36	Association. All 16 counties shall be represented
37	among the commission's membership.

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1 Sec. 2. 3 MRSA §272 is repealed and the 2 following enacted in its place:

## 3 §272. Tenure of office

The legislative members shall hold office from the dates of their original appointments until final adjournment of the next succeeding regular session of the Legislature following their appointments. County and municipal officials shall hold office only as long as they hold municipal office. All other members shall serve for 2-year terms.

11 Sec. 3. 3 MRSA §273, as amended by PL 1985, c. 12 737, Pt. B, §2, is further amended to read:

## 13 §273. Organization and procedure

14 The commission shall organize by the choice of one 15 of its members to be its chairman. The Office of 16 Fiscal and Program Review the Executive Director of 17 the Legislative Council shall serve as the secretariat 18 of the commission. The commission may enact such 19 rules governing its procedure and the conduct of its 20 affairs not inconsistent with law as it may see fit.

21 Sec. 4. 3 MRSA §274, sub-§§2, 3, 8 & 9 are 22 amended to read:

23 2. Forum. To provide a forum for discussing the 24 administration and coordination of federal and state 25 grant programs;

26 3. <u>Administration of programs.</u> To give critical 27 attention to the conditions and controls involved in 28 the administration of federal and state grant 29 programs;

30 8. Legislation. To recommend to the <u>State</u> 31 <u>Government and Federal Government changes in present</u> 32 <del>federal</del> laws and to recommend any new legislation the 33 commission deems advisable; and

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9. Cooperate with other agencies. To work with

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national, state and local organizations including, but
 not limited to, the American Municipal Association,
 United States Conference of Mayors, the Maine
 Municipal Association, and other public and private
 organizations.

# Sec. 5. 3 MRSA §275 is amended to read:

### §275. Meetings; hearings; committees

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The commission shall hold meetings quarterly, the first to be held on the 2nd Wednesday in January, and 8 9 10 at such other times as it deems necessary. If there is a vacancy on the commission as of the 2nd Wednesday 11 in January, a quorum shall consist of a majority of 12 13 the members who have been appointed by that date. The 14 commission shall hold hearings from time to time on matters that it deems to be in the public interest. 15 16 The commission shall have power to establish such 17 delegations and committees as it deems advisable, 18 whose members may or may not be made up from the 19 members of the commission, from state officials or 20 from private citizens, such delegations or committees 21 to be charged with the duty of conferring and formulating proposals concerning effective means to 22 intergovernmental harmony and of performing 23 secure 24 such other functions for the commission as it may from 25 time to time require.

26 Sec. 6. 3 MRSA §276, as amended by PL 1983, c.
27 812, §8, is further amended to read:

#### 28 §276. Reports; compensation

29 The commission shall report to the Governor and the Legislature at least 30 days before the convening of each regular legislative session<del>, which report</del> 30 31 of 32 shall be transmitted bу the Governor to the hegislature, and it may report to the Governor such other times as it deems appropriate. 33 at 34 appropriate. The 35 commission may solicit and accept such grants or funds 36 as it may require to carry out its duties. Its members shall be compensated as provided in Title 57 chapter 379 serve without compensation but shall 37 38 39 receive necessary travel and expenses.

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Sec. 7. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

12 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 13 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 14 approved.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

16 The Commission on Intergovernmental Relations was 17 established to provide a forum for the discussion and 18 development of long-range plans for State. the Specifically, it was designed to bring state and local 19 20 governmental representatives together to work 21 cooperatively on issues of common concern. This 22 commission has been active for 4 years. In the last 6 23 the Federal Government has given State years, 24 Government and local government an increasingly 25 important role in regulating and funding services for its citizens. These added responsibilities, and the decrease in federal funding, have highlighted the need 26 its citizens. 27 28 for cooperation among all levels of government.

29 This bill increases the number of members of the 30 that commission to assure each Maine county is 31 represented. In addition, it establishes an annual 32 date for the commission to meet, specifies its role in the design and development of state policy and state 33 34 legislation and provides funding to cover commission 35 expenses.

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
