7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 796, L.D. 2093, 8 Bill, "AN ACT to Create a Single Point of Contact for 9 the Operators of Commercial Vehicles."

Amend the Bill in section 1 in the 6th line (page 11 2, line 4 in L.D.) by striking out the underlined 12 figures and word "<u>1703 and 2703</u>" and inserting in 13 their place the following: '<u>1703, 2703</u> and 2704'

14 Further amend the Bill in section 3 in that part 15 designated "<u>§1703.</u>" in the first paragraph in the 4th 16 line (page 2, line 35 in L.D.) by inserting after the 17 underlined word "<u>State</u>" the following: ', acting with 18 the advice of the Commissioner of Transportation,'

Further amend the Bill in section 3 in that part designated "<u>§1703.</u>" in the 3rd paragraph from the end in the 11th and 12th lines (page 5, lines 7 and 8 in L.D.) by striking out the words "based on mileage and the number of officers assigned" and inserting in their place the following: 'based on mileage and the number-of-officers-assigned'

Further amend the Bill in section 5 in the last paragraph by striking out all of the 3rd underlined sentence.

29 Further amend the Bill by striking out all of 30 section 7 and inserting in its place the following:

1 'Sec. 7. 29 MRSA §2706, as enacted by PL 1981, 2 c. 469, §2, is repealed.'

3 Further amend the Bill in section 8 in that part 4 designated "<u>§2707.</u>" in the first paragraph, first line 5 (page 7, line 36 in L.D.) by striking out the word 6 "bureau" and inserting in its place the following: 7 'bureau Bureau of State Police'

8 Further amend the Bill in section 8 in that part 9 designated "§2707." in the 2nd paragraph, 6th and 7th 10 lines (page 8, lines 23 and 24 in L.D.) by striking 11 out the words "Public Utilities Commission or" and 12 inserting in their place the following: 'Public 13 Utilities-Commission-or'

14 Further amend the Bill in section 8 in that part 15 designated "§2707." in the 2nd paragraph, 5th line 16 from the end (page 8, line 38 in L.D.) by striking out 17 the words "Public Utilities Commission or" and 18 inserting in their place the following: 'Public 19 Utilities-Commission-or'

20 Further amend the Bill in section 9 in that part designated "§2708." in the first paragraph by striking 21 out all of the first underlined sentence and inserting 22 out all of the first underlined sentence and inserting in its place the following: 'The Secretary of State shall not register any motor vehicle required to obtain an operating permit subject to this chapter nor issue a permit covering the operation of any such motor vehicle or vehicles, until the applicant for that permit has procured a good and sufficient insurance policy or indemnity bond, in such amount as the Secretary of State prescribes, having as surety, a surety company authorized to transact business in this 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 surety company authorized to transact business in this State or 2 responsible individuals, which bond shall 31 32 33 be approved by the Secretary of State, or a 34 declaratory judgment issued by the Interstate Commerce 35 Commission authorizing the motor carrier to self 36 insure.

37 Further amend the Bill by striking out all of 38 section 13 and inserting in its place the following:

39 'Sec. 13. Transfer of functions; transition. 40 The following transfer of functions and transition 41 apply.

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H.J.S.

1 Functions transferred. This section provides 1. for the transition in transferring the administrative 2 3 functions and related rule-making authority for 4 issuing overweight and oversize permits from the Department of Transportation to the Division of Motor 5 6 Vehicles; and transferring the administrative 7 and related rule-making authority for functions issuing operating authority permits for persons, firms 8 corporations transporting freight, merchandise, 9 or household goods or passengers by motor vehicle for 10 11 hire from the Bureau of State Police to the Division of Motor Vehicles. This establishes the Division of Motor Vehicles, which already issues vehicle registrations and licenses for fuel use reporting, as 12 13 14 15 a single point of contact for the administration of 16 licensing and permitting of commercial vehicles.

2. <u>Funds transferred.</u> Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, sections 1585 and 1586, all 17 18 accrued expenditures, assets, liabilities, balances, appropriations or allocations, transfers, revenues or 19 20 21 other available funds in any account or subdivision of an account of any unit of State Government related to a function transferred by this Act shall be 22 23 24 transferred to the unit which receives the 25 responsibility for that function.

26 3. Transfer of employee benefits. Any employees 27 of any unit of State Government who may be transferred 28 to the Department of the Secretary of State, Division 29 of Motor Vehicles, shall be transferred with their 30 accrued rights and benefits. The accrued fringe benefits, including vacation and sick leave, health 31 and life insurance, and retirement shall remain with 32 33 those persons.

34 4. <u>Rules and procedures</u>. All rules and 35 procedures relating to the functions transferred by 36 this Act currently in effect and in operation and 37 which are in compliance with this Act shall remain in 38 effect until rescinded or amended as provided by law.

39 5. <u>Contracts and agreements</u>. All contracts and 40 agreements currently in effect with respect to any 41 unit of State Government affected by this Act shall

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1 remain in effect until rescinded, terminated or 2 modified as provided by law.

3 6. Equipment and property transferred. A11 equipment and property of the State used by employees and officials of any unit of State Government related to a function transferred by this Act shall be 4 5 6 7 unit transferred the which receives the to 8 responsibility for that function.

9 7. Organization and operation. Notwithstand other provision of law, any appointment Notwithstanding 10 any and 11 preparation work for the transfer of functions 12 required by this Act may be made or may occur prior to the appropriate effective date of this Act, but shall not become binding or take effect until the 13 not become binding or 14 15 appropriate effective date.

16 8. <u>Financial order required.</u> The Deputy 17 Secretary of State, the Commissioner of Public Safety 18 and the Commissioner of Transportation shall jointly 19 prepare a financial order to transfer the necessary 20 funds, positions, equipment and property to implement 21 this Act. They shall submit that order to the Budget 22 Office in a timely manner so that the transfer can be 23 carried out prior to February 1, 1989.

24 Sec. 14. Allocation. The following funds are 25 allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the 26 purposes of this Act.

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7 Sec. 15. Effective date. This Act shall take 8 effect July 1, 1989, except that sections 13 and 14 9 shall take effect February 1, 1989.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

11 This amendment retains the purpose of the bill to 12 provide a single point of contact for licensing and 13 permitting of commercial vehicles and makes some minor 14 changes. The amendment to section 1 of the bill 15 clarifies that the Secretary of State will collect all 16 fees relating to operating authority.

17 The amendment to section 2 ensures that the 18 Department of Transportation will be able to conduct 19 engineering reviews of proposed overload permits that 20 exceed the limits of the general guidelines.

The amendment to section 3 removes the limitations on the establishment of escort fees and would allow the State Police to consider all relevant criteria.

The amendment to section 5 allows the Secretary of State to design operating permit applications without the necessity of going through rulemaking.

The amendment to sections 7 and 8 deletes obsolete language referring to the Public Utilities Commission in Title 29, sections 2706 and 2707.

30 The amendment to section 8 identifies the Bureau 31 of State Police for clarity.

32 The amendment to section 9 allows the Secretary of 33 State to set liability insurance requirements without

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1 review by the Bureau of State Police.

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2 The amendment adds a section dealing with the 3 transfer of functions and the transition. It is 4 understood that 3 positions will be transferrd from 5 the Department of Transportation and 11 positions from 6 the Department of Public Safety to the Division of 7 Motor Vehicles, in addition to the new branch chief 8 supervisor position created in the Division of Motor 9 Vehicles by the allocation section.

10 Finally, the amendment adds an allocation and 11 modifies the effective date to allow 5 months start-up 12 time for the new person added to the Division of Motor 13 Vehicles to supervise this operation.
