### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Change the Definition of Wine

2 Coolers. 3 4 Emergency preamble. of the Whereas, 5 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days 6 after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Public Law 1987, 275, chapter extended Maine's bottle bill to include wine coolers but not other wine products; and

- Whereas, under that legislation, wine products 1 which are not wine coolers were inadvertently included 2 3 in the definition; and
- Whereas, that provision was to take effect April 4 1, 1988, this bill is immediately necessary to clarify 6 the definition; and
- 7 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 8 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the 9 10 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 11 12 now, therefore,
- 13 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 14 follows:
- 32 MRSA §1862, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1987, 15
- 16 c. 275, §1, is further amended to read:
- 1. <u>Beverage.</u> "Beverage" means beer, ale or other drink produced by fermenting malt, soda water or other 17 18 19 nonalcoholic carbonated drink in liquid form and 20
- intended for human consumption. "Beverage" also includes wine coolers. "Wine cooler" means a beverage containing wine and more than 15% added 21 ... 22
- 23 natural or artificial blending material, such as fruit 24 juices, flavors, flavorings or adjuncts, plain, carbonated or sparkling water; coloring; or 25
- preservatives, and which contains less than 7% of alcohol by volume. "Wine cooler" means a beverage containing wine and more than 15% added plain, carbonated or sparkling water; and which contains 26 27 28
- 29 added natural or artificial blended material, such as
- 30 fruit juices, flavors, flavoring, adjuncts, coloring or preservatives; and which contains less than 7% 31 32 alcohol by volume. 33.
- Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect April 1, 1988. April 1 (1988) April
