## STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This bill increases eligibility levels for the 5 elderly circuit breaker and the elderly low-cost drug 6 program to \$7,700 for single individuals and \$9,500 7 for households with 2 or more members. It also 8 increases benefits and eligibility levels under the 9 nonelderly circuit breaker and repeals the sunset on 10 that program.

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
