5 6 7 8	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
9 0 1	Whereas, the Legislature created the Commission to Study the Use of Involuntary Services for Substance

1 2 3	Whereas, the commission, now established, finds it urgently necessary to extend its reporting deadline in order to satisfactorily complete its task; and
4 5 6 7 8 9	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
10 11 12	Resolve 1987, chapter 72. Resolved: That Resolve 1987, c. 72, 6th $\P$ from the end, is amended to read:
13 14 15 16 17	Report. Resolved: That the commission shall prepare a report to be submitted, together with any accompanying legislation, no later than January 317 1988 March 15, 1988, to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature; and be it further
18 19 20	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
21	STATEMENT OF FACT
22 23	The purpose of this resolve is to extend the reporting deadline of the commission for 6 weeks.
