This amount shall be payable at 9% le interest in not more than 10 annual 23 simple interest installments. These installment payments 24 shall commence at such time as the student concludes or 25 26 interrupts professional education under rules 27 promulgated by the commissioner. 28 Deferment. Any student who has received a 29 loan under this section may seek a deferment of the annual principal and interest payments for a period not to exceed 3 years. A request for deferment must 30 31 32 made to the commissioner who shall make 33 determination on a case-by-case basis. The decision of the commissioner shall be final. 34 35
 - 4. Cancellation. The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services may cancel the total amount of the loan of any student who has received a loan under this section if that student completes 4 years of service in this State as a nurse in a designated,

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6 STATEMENT OF FACT

Maine is currently experiencing a critical shortage of nursing personnel in the health care industry. This bill establishes a loan program for nursing education and a provision to waive repayment of that loan for a specified period of service as a nurse in those areas of Maine which have been designated as being underserved.

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
