- 1. Commissioner's recommendation. The commissioner's recommended budget to the Governor for the purchase of contracted child day care services shall be adjusted at a minimum to include an estimate of the amount needed to maintain the number of slots subsidized by the department in the current year. In making the estimate, the commissioner shall consider:
- A. Local economic conditions which affect the salary level needed to attract and retain qualified child day care workers in each area; and
  - B. Changes in the average costs of facilities, materials and other personnel reflected in Data Resources, Inc., indexes for health care facilities.
- 2. Governor's recommendation. The Governor shall incorporate the commissioner's recommendation in the budget document submitted to the Legislature. The budget document shall include an analysis of the effect which any difference between the Governor's recommendation and the commissioner's recommendation will have on the number of subsidized child day care slots for which the department contracts.
- 3. Increasing child day care slots. Nothing in this section may be construed as limiting the commissioner's or the Governor's ability to recommend increases in the number of child day care slots subsidized by the State.

#### 30 FISCAL NOTE

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This bill will result in future costs to the General Fund. The exact fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time since local economic conditions, the Data Resources, Inc., forecasts for health care facilities and the funding level of the Social Services Block Grant have yet to be determined.

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This bill requires the Commissioner of Human include Department of Services to in the Services' budget recommendations to the Governor 5 sufficient funds to maintain the number of subsidized child day department care slots for which the 7 contracted in the current year. In calculating the amount of funds needed, the commissioner must take 8 9 local economic conditions which . into consideration affect salary levels in each area and average changes in the State for the cost of facilities, materials and 10 11 12 other personnel. The bill further requires the 13 Governor to include in the budget document submitted the Legislature an analysis of the effect the 14 Governor's recommended budget will have on increasing 15 16 or decreasing the number of subsidized child day care 17 slots purchased by the department. The bill does not limit the Governor's final budget authority. 18

The First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature included in the budget provisions for providing sufficient funds to increase the number of subsidized child day care slots to make up for slots lost because of inflation over the past years. In addition, it provided money for a 5% salary increase for child day care workers and cost-of-living adjustments for this biennium. This bill would insure that these improvements are not eroded in the future.
