AN ACT to Clarify the Laws Relating to Atlantic Salmon Conservation.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 5 follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

26 This bill is intended to clarify inconsistencies 27 between laws and current regulations of the Atlantic 28 Sea Run Salmon Commission.

The bill amends the laws to clarify a standard of measure for minimum size and addresses the method of harvest and closed season during the period of April lst to July 15th. The bag limit and season limit provisions are expanded to cover all waters of the State and not only designated waters at the mouths of

salmon rivers as is now the case. Since current law does not address bag and season limits outside designated salmon waters, these limits are difficult to enforce. Atlantic salmon caught in Maine waters would not be allowed to be sold, except those fish lawfully raised by means of aquaculture.

The bill repeals the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6256, subsection 4, paragraph A; and subsections 5 and 6, concerning registration requirement exemptions and commercial and recreational fishing provisions, and replaces these sections with a revised recreational fishing provision. The effect of this change is to require all Atlantic salmon caught to be registered; to provide a mechanism for salmon salmon caught incidentally by recreational fishermen to be legally kept, tagged and registered, provided that daily and seasonal bag limits are not exceeded; and to prohibit the retention of salmon caught incidentally by commercial fishermen.

The bill allows a recreational fisherman on a 2-day or 3-day trip along the coast to be exempt from the 12-hour registration time limit requirement for salmon. A fisherman may provide registration information to the commission or its agents within 24 hours of the first landfall.

The bill provides a mechanism whereby all salmon caught in Maine waters may be tagged and clearly identified.

29 The bill allows for a person to legally possess 30 Atlantic salmon which have been caught in Canadian 31 Atlantic maritime provinces and imported into Maine or 32 caught in offshore Maine waters by a recreational 33 fisherman.

The bill provides definitions for length measurements, total length and fork length, to determine legal sizes of finfish species taken from Maine waters.
