RESOLVE. Establishing the Commission to Study

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on Economic Development and one from the general public; 3 members shall be appointed by the Speaker 2 of the House, including one from the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation, one from the Joint Standing Committee on Economic Development and 5 from the general public; and 3 members shall appointed by the Governor, including one from the Department of Transportation, one from the Department of Economic Development and one from the general 9 public; and be it further

11 Recommendations. That the commission Resolved: shall make its recommendations to the First Regular 12 Session of the 114th Legislature by December 1, 1988; 13 and be it further 14

15 Issues. Resolved: That the commission examine Route 9 between Calais and Bangor, the roads from Searsport and Eastport leading to Route 9 and 17 other roads connecting with Route 9 along the stretch 18 19 between Bangor and Calais. The commission shall be 20 concerned with the adequacy of the road system as it 21 relates to the existing economic activity of the area, 22 . the future economic development of the area, the needs of commercial traffic and the safety of dual use of 23 the road system by commercial carriers and private automobiles. The commission shall include an 24 25 assessment of the cost and feasibility of a major 26 upgrade of the roads in the system, especially Route 27 9; the issue of the acquisition of rights-of-way; the environmental impact of any improvements on the road 28 29 30 system and the economic growth these improvements might stimulate; and a cost benefit assessment of any 31 32 changes to the State, commercial activities 33 ... property owners. The commission may examine other factors related to issues outlined in this resolve; 34
