7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 817, L.D. 2137, 8 Bill, "AN ACT to Amend the Principles of Reimbursement 9 for Nonhealth Employees of Nursing Homes."

10 Amend the bill by striking out everything after 11 the enacting clause and inserting in its place the 12 following:

13 'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA \$1708, sub-\$2, as repealed and 14 replaced by PL 1975, c. 365, \$1, is amended to read:

15 2. Compensation for nursing homes. A nursing 16 home, as defined under section 1812-A, or any portion of a hospital or institution operated as a nursing 17 home, when the State is liable for payment for care, 18 shall be reimbursed at a rate established by the 19 20 Department of Human Services pursuant to this subsection. The department shall not establish a 21 subsection. The department shall not establish a so-called "flat rate." The department shall establish for each nursing home a payment rate or payment rates relating to various types of care provided in a nursing home. Such rate or rates shall be based on 22 23 24 25 the operating costs attributable to each nursing home 26 27 as determined by such accounting and auditing standards and procedures as the department may establish. The provisions of this subsection shall 28 29 30 apply to all funds, including federal funds, paid by

any agency of the State to a nursing home for patient
care. The provisions of this subsection shall apply,
notwithstanding any other provisions of law.

4 determining the appropriate reimbursement In with 5 respect to nonhealth personnel staff costs, excluding administrative staff, the department shall, to the extent of available resources, make the adjustments necessary to equalize the imbalance which existed in the base wage rate and which has been exaggerated by inflationary adjustments. In determining this adjustment, the department shall consider, at a minimum labor market conditions. 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 minimum, labor market conditions, shortages in the 13 labor pool, demonstrated inability to recruit or retain qualified nonhealth personnel and the extent to 14 which any previous inflationary increases in the per diem rate are reflected in the current salary of those 15 16 employees. Interim adjustments to the reimbursement rate may be made by the department when appropriate. 17 18

19 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are 20 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 21 purposes of this Act.

FISCAL NOTE

2 Enactment of this legislation could require а 3 General Fund appropriation of \$548,383 in fiscal year 4 1989 to payments to providers of intermediate care and 5 a federal allocation to the same account in the amount 6 of \$1,102,377. This fiscal note is based on providing a \$.25 per hour increase to 2,213 nonhealth nursing 7 home employees which would be in addition to any 8 increase already included in the reimbursement rate for fiscal year 1989. The actual increase for each employee will vary based on the criteria established 9 10 11 12 by this bill.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

14 This amendment addresses the difficulty nursing 15 homes are experiencing in recruiting and retaining qualified nonhealth personnel by providing an interim 16 17 personnel wage adjustment for those when The adjustment shall equalize the 18 appropriate. 19 imbalances in wages which have been exaggerated by the 20 across-the-board percentage wage increases to account for inflation. For example, those who started at the lowest salary will get the most increase. Wage adjustments are only available for those nursing homes 21 22 23 24 which have passed along the previous adjustments for 25 inflation. In addition, nursing homes are required to show inability to compete for wages in the labor 26 market and have a hardship in recruiting and retaining 27 28 staff. This amendment also adds a fiscal note and an 29 appropriation.
