STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Relating to the Weighing of Trucks.

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 4 follows:

29 MRSA §1805, as amended by PL 1979, c. 588, 5 6 §5, is further amended to read:

7 §1805. Penalty for violations

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The operator or owner of any vehicle entering or

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l leaving the State, or operating within the State, who refuses to permit the weighing of such vehicle is guilty of a Class E crime, except that a fine of not more than \$17000 \$1,500 and a sentence of imprisonment of not more than 30 days may be imposed. All fines and forfeitures collected shall accrue to the General Highway Fund.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the maximum penalty for refusing to allow a truck to be 9 10 11 weighed from \$1,000 to \$1,500. Currently, it is possible that it would be less expensive in many cases 12 for the user of an overweight truck to refuse to be weighed than to pay the fine for operating 13 14 15 Maximum truck overweight fines were overweight. increased by the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature from \$1,000 to a practical maximum of 16 17 about \$1,500. This bill would make this section more 18 consistent with other provisions of the law. 19

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
