AN ACT to Provide for Child Care and Child Development Training for Student Parents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

14	STATEMENT OF FACT
15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26	The purpose of this bill is to make school sponsored child care services available to teenage parents to help them remain in school or to complete their education if they have dropped out of school. Child care slots not used by the children of students may be used by the children of teachers or other employees of the school. The service shall be free to the children of students but school administrative units may charge teachers and other employees a fee. Parenting education and developmental training for student parents is to be included as part of the program.
27 28 29 30	The bill requires school administrative units which provide child care services to offer a one-semester course in parenting to secondary school students.
31 32 33 34	The costs not covered by fees charged to teachers or other employees with children enrolled in the schools' child care services are subsidizable under the School Finance Act of 1985.
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
