12 13 14	Amend the Bill in section 8 in the part designated "§2955." in subsection 4 by adding at the end a new paragraph as follows:
15 16 17 18 19 20	'Any person employed as a senior agent or special agent investigator within the Maine State Police may be temporarily assigned to the bureau. During such temporary assignment, the Maine State Police shall retain the positions of senior agent and special agent investigator.'

- of the bureau. The rules, practices and policies of the bureau shall be in conformity with state law and with the advice, consultation and direction provided by the board and shall accomplish the goal of an integrated drug enforcement effort. These rules, practices and policies may include:
- 7 A. The qualifications, hiring, term of service 8 and disciplinary standards for supervisors and 9 agents;
- 10 Protection as to financial and employment security for any law enforcement officer selected 11 12 as any official of the bureau with respect to the person's position with any municipal, county or 13 14 law enforcement state policy or political 15 subdivision;
- 16 C. Standard operating procedures for the bureau;
- D. Procurement procedures; or
- 18 E. Procedures for dissemination of records.'
- 19 STATEMENT OF FACT
- This amendment protects the employment rights of those employees occupying the positions of senior agent and special agent investigator in the Bureau of State Police. If they are temporarily assigned to the new Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement Bureau and that assignment should end, then this amendment ensures that they could return to their former positions within the Bureau of State Police.
- The amendment also removes the requirement that the Commissioner of Public Safety always adopt rules, practices and policies affecting the bureau in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, and substitute the requirement that the commissioner adopt them in accordance with the applicable state law.
