12 Amend the bill in section 8, by inserting at the
13 end the following:

14 '5. Compensation; State Police personnel.
15 Notwithstanding any other provision in this section,
16 Maine State Police officers, senior agents and special
17 investigative agents who are temporarily assigned to
18 the bureau will continue to be paid from the budget of
19 the Bureau of State Police, except that any additional
20 compensation arising from such temporary assignment
21 shall be paid from the budget of the bureau.'

This amendment makes it clear that State Police officers, senior agents and special investigative agents will continue to be paid their normal salaries by the Bureau of State Police and any additional compensation arising out of temporary assignment to the Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement will be paid by that bureau.


