1                   **RESOLVE, to Establish a Study Commission on**  
2                   **Maine Job Service Procedures.**  
3

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
5 follows:

6                   **Commission established. Resolved:** That there  
7 is established the Study Commission on Maine Job  
8 Service Procedures; and be it further

1           **Membership; appointment; compensation.**  
2 **Resolved:** That the commission shall be comprised of  
3 the following members: Five Legislators to be  
4 appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and  
5 the Speaker of the House; 2 members to be appointed by  
6 the Governor; the Commissioner of Labor or his  
7 designee; and the Commissioner of Department of  
8 Educational and Cultural Services or his designee.  
9 All appointments shall be made within 30 days of the  
10 effective date of this resolve. The members shall  
11 select a chairman. The Chairman of the Legislative  
12 Council shall call the first meeting of the commission.

13           The members of the commission who are legislators  
14 shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in  
15 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for  
16 days of attendance at commission meetings. The  
17 members of the commission shall receive reimbursement  
18 for expenses; and be it further

19           **Study.** **Resolved:** That the commission shall  
20 study the procedures and methods used by the Maine Job  
21 Service in rendering its services. Included in the  
22 study shall be a review of the manner in which the  
23 Maine Job Service provides services to all age and  
24 economic groups and whether the services provided to  
25 those different groups may be provided more adequately  
26 or on a more equal basis; and be it further

27           **Assistance.** **Resolved:** That, if staff  
28 assistance is desired, assistance shall be requested  
29 from the Legislative Council; and be it further

30           **Report.** **Resolved:** That the commission shall  
31 submit the report, including any necessary  
32 implementing legislation, to the First Regular Session  
33 of the 114th Legislature; and be it further

34           **Appropriation.** **Resolved:** That the following  
35 funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry  
36 out the purposes of this resolve.
