AN ACT to Make Interim Adjustments and Establish a Prospective Reimbursement System for Boarding Care Facilities Serving the Mentally Retarded.

6 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 7 follows:

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Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §7907-A is enacted to read:

The department shall develop, in consultation with 4 5 provider and consumer groups, prospective а 6 reimbursement system to be implemented July 1, 1989, for boarding care facilities serving persons with mental retardation. This system shall be based upon actual costs incurred by these facilities in providing 7 8 9 their services for fiscal year 1988-89. 10
