IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Revise the Definition of Spouse Under the Maine State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. **5 MRSA §17001, sub-§39,** as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 7, is amended to read:

39. Spouse. "Spouse" means the person currently

legally married to a member or, if the member is retired, the person the member was married to at the time of retirement.

4 Sec. 2. Application. This bill shall apply to 5 all members retiring after September 30, 1985, and to 6 the determination of spousal benefits in a case where 7 a member retired prior to September 30, 1985, but dies 8 after September 30, 1985.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill defines spouse as the person a member of 10 11 the Maine State Retirement System was married to at the time of retirement. This protects the pension rights of the spouse who was married to the member at 12 . 13 14 time the member chose a retirement the option 15 including a spousal benefit. The Maine State 16 Retirement System's calculation of an actuarially 17 based reduction in benefit to fund the spousal benefit is also based on the spouse, specifically the age of the spouse the member was married to at the time of retirement. In the case of special spousal benefits 18 19 20 provided certain categories of employees, it protects 21 22 the spouse who was married to the member while the pension was earned from a loss of pension rights 23 24 resulting from a divorce which occurs after retirement.
