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deficiencies in the current level of the program and recommends that increased activities be funded. These increased activities are necessary to provide maximum availability of shellfish harvesting beds and to ensure State compliance with national shellfish sanitation standards in order to protect public health and safety.

8 In recognition that the expansion of the State's 9 efforts to benefit the commercial activity of shellfish harvesting as well as the general public, 10 11 this bill provides for funding for the expanded 12 program from 2 sources. It provides for an increase of \$25 in shellfish licenses, shellfish transportation licenses, and hand and boat mussel licenses. The bill 13 14 15 changes the percentage from these license fees going to the Shellfish Fund in order to ensure that the fee increases go to the General Fund and that the amount 16 17 of revenues going to the Shellfish Fund will remain 18 the same as under current law. The license increase 19 20 proposed will result in increased revenues of \$107,200. The remaining funding in the amount of 21 22 \$245,014 is proposed to come from other general 23 revenue sources.

The additional revenues are intended to provide funding to the Department of Marine Resources to increase personnel and to implement a proposal to increase shellfish monitoring and sanitation activities through the creation of new laboratory facilities in the Lamoine area.

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
