STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Improve the Marketing of Potatoes by Strengthening the Maine Bag Program.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6 **Sec. 1. 7 MRSA 1035,** as repealed and replaced 7 by PL 1987, c. 99, §16, is amended to read:

§1035. Maine bag logo

Maine Potato Quality Control Board The shall adopt an official logo which, at a minimum,
shall contain an outline of the shape of the State
and may shall require its use on all Maine bags. The purpose of the logo is to assure consumers of the uniform quality, cleanliness and size of the potatoes. In-state packers who have paid a tax in accordance with Title 36, section 4605, shall use the logo, provided inspection is completed in compliance with section 1034. Out-of-state packers may use the logo for a fee to be established by the commissioner provided that in-state packing requirements have been met.

1-A. Variety. No person may pack potatoes in a Maine bag, unless those potatoes are of a variety approved by the commissioner. The commissioner shall promulgate rules, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, to develop a method of sampling and testing potatoes for compliance with this subsection. If before shipment it is suspected that the potatoes do not conform to the requirements of this subsection, the suspected violation shall not be grounds for refusal to ship the potatoes. If it is subsequently discovered that the shipment is not in compliance with this subsection, the violator shall be subject to the penalty in subsection 3.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill seeks to strengthen the marketing of Maine potatoes by requiring the Maine Potato Quality Control Board to adopt an offical logo and to require its use on all Maine bags. In-state packers are required to use the logo if they have paid a potato tax and completed inspection. Out-of-state packers may use the logo for a fee if they have complied with in-state packing requirements.
