# STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

Whereas, the implementation of the recommendations of the School Funding Task Force creates an immediate need for the Department of Educational and Cultural

- 1 Services to revise its school funding formula and 2 provide a significant increase in the amount of 3 subsidy for statewide school operating and program 4 costs; and
- Whereas, the effective date of this Act is July 1, 6 1988; and
- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 14 follows:
- 17 3. Percentage. Effective 1989-90, the percentage 18 of the State's share of the operating cost allocation 29 on a statewide basis shall be no less than the 20 percentage of the State's share in 1988-89.
- Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §15605, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. G, §§2 and 4, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 3. Guidelines for actual local operating and program costs; updating. Effective 1988-89, the 24 25 26 commissioner's recommendation for actual local 27 operating and program costs adjusted, exclusive of bus purchase costs, shall reflect changes in 28 pupil 29 enrollment, economic factors, the average of the 2 30 recent annual percentages of increase statewide operating and programs costs of school administrative units and any other considerations 31 32 33 which effect a change in the costs of education. 34 commissioner shall be conscious of the need for prudent restraint in educational financing. 35.

	6 7 8 9 10	A. Each school administrative unit shall be guaranteed a minimum state allocation for operating costs that is 75% of that unit's state allocation for operating costs during the previous year. These funds shall be included as a part of the total allocation.

All school administrative units that have above average mills raised for education, below state average income and above average poverty, shall be held harmless at 90% of that unit's state allocation for operating costs during the previous year. These funds shall be included as part of the total allocation.

Effective 1988-89, each school administrative unit shall be guaranteed a minimum state share of its total allocation that is determined by multiplying 5% of the foundation per pupil operating rate by the average number of resident kindergarten to grade 12 pupils, including special education tuition pupils, in the unit on April 1st and October 1st of the calendar year immediately prior to the year of allocation. These funds shall be included as part of the total allocation.
	29 30 31	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1988.
