7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 847, L.D. 2203, 8 "Resolve, Establishing the Commission to Study the 9 Status of the Nursing and Health Care Professions in 10 Maine."

11 Amend the resolve by striking out all of the title 12 and inserting in its place the following:

13 'RESOLVE, To Establish the Commission to Study 14 the Status of Nursing Professions in Maine.'

15 Further amend the resolve by striking out 16 everything after the title and inserting in its place 17 the following:

18 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves 19 of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 20 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; 21 and

22 Whereas, the State has a fundamental obligation to 23 assure that hospitals and nursing homes receive 24 sufficient reimbursement to meet their nursing staff 25 needs; and

26 Whereas, a determination of the appropriate 27 mechanism to meet these needs will require further 28 analysis and experimentation; and

29 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these

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1 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 2 Constitution of Maine and require the following 3 legislation as immediately necessary for the 4 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 5 now, therefore, be it

6 Commission established. Resolved: That there 7 is established the Commission to Study the Status of 8 Nursing Professions in Maine; and be it further

9 Membership; appointment; compensation. That the commission shall consist of 17 10 Resolved: members as follows: Two Senators, appointed by the President of the Senate; 3 members of the House of 11 12 Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House; the Commissioner of Human Services or a 13 14 15 designee; the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural 16 Services or a designee; the Commissioner of Labor or a designee; 3 members of the general public who are 17 consumers of health care, but who are neither nursing 18 19 health professionals nor care management professionals, one appointed by the President of the 20 Senate, one appointed by the Speaker of the House and 21 one appointed by the Governor; 3 members representing 22 direct care nursing staff, one appointed by the President of the Senate, one appointed by the Speaker 23 24 25 of the House and one appointed by the Governor; and 3 26 health care management professionals, one appointed by 27 the President of the Senate, one appointed by the 28 Speaker of the House and one appointed by the Governor.

29 In appointing the members representing direct care 30 staff and nursing the health care management 31 professionals, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House and the Governor shall solicit a 32 33 list of direct care nursing staff representatives recommended for membership on the commission from 34 35 organizations representing direct care nursing staff 36 and a list of health care management professionals 37 recommended for membership on the commission from health care management organizations. 38 The President 39 of the Senate, the Speaker of the House and the Governor shall consider the names submitted by those 40 41 professional organizations before making their appointments of the nursing professionals and health 42 43 care management professionals.

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The commission shall select a chairman from among 1 2 its members. The Chairman of the Legislative Council 3 shall convene the first meeting, which shall take place no later than 30 calendar days after the 4 5 effective date of this resolve. Legislative members of the commission shall receive per diem compensation 6 and other voting members of the commission shall be compensated for their expenses. The commission may organize subcommittees to investigate specific areas 7 8 9 10 of study and may hold hearings in the course of its 11 study; and be it further

12 Study authorized. Resolved: That the 13 commission shall conduct an independent analysis and 14 review of:

15 1. The current problem of nursing availability 16 for health care services in the community, including 17 home health, hospitals, nursing homes and boarding 18 home facilities, industrial nurses, schools and other 19 health care institutions or entities, both public and 20 private, concerning recruitment and retention;

21 The appropriate role in the patient assessment 2. 22 team of direct care personnel in the State's hospitals, nursing homes and home health agencies, 23 24 defining the education and skill required for each 25 classification level and the appropriate method of 26 certification, including adequacy of management 27 training for these personnel;

3. The appropriate method of determining
classification levels of staff required to provide the
level of care needed in today's nursing homes,
boarding home facilities and home care agencies;

4. The nursing staff-to-patient ratio required to staff adequately hospitals, nursing homes, boarding home facilities and home care agencies to meet the growing demands placed on the State's health care system and the potential labor supply, by region, available in the State;

38 5. The ability of the State's educational system 39 to meet basic nurse's training and education needs and 40 to supply ongoing nurse's training and education which 41 will allow vertical movement within a facility setting; COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 847, L.D. 2203

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1 6. The growth of nursing pool agencies and what 2 impact those agencies have on the current projected 3 nursing shortage;

4 7. The wage benefits and incentives required to 5 attract and retain people from the available state 6 labor pool appropriate to each job classification and 7 region of the State;

8 8. The various reimbursement systems for and 9 agencies regulating training, education and wages for 10 home health, nursing home and hospital services to 11 study and evaluate how the various reimbursement 12 systems could be better coordinated and develop 13 recommendations to correct any inequities which might 14 exist;

15 9. Strategies to resolve nursing and other direct 16 care provider shortages in all areas of health care;

17 10. Appropriate marketing approaches to the field 18 of nursing to raise the expectations of those entering 19 the profession and to assist in the recoupment and 20 retention of those in the profession; and

21 II. The impact of the shortage in the nursing 22 professions on the delivery of quality health care and 23 its effects on both nursing personnel and health care 24 consumers in urban, suburban and rural health care 25 facilities and settings; and be it further

26 Reports. Resolved: That the commission shall 27 present its findings, together with any recommended 28 legislation, to the joint standing committee of the 29 Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources 30 to the First Regular Session of the 114th Legislature 31 by March 1, 1989; and be it further

32 Assistance. Resolved: That the Department of 33 Human Services, the Department of Educational and 34 Cultural Services and the Department of Labor shall 35 provide staff support for this commission, and that further staff assistance may be requested, 36 as 37 necessary, from the Legislative Council; and be it 38 further

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1 Appropriation. Changes the membership of the commission to 28 include 17 members instead of 15; 29 2. Moves the reporting date from February 1, 1989 30 to March 1, 1989; 31 3. Changes those who shall provide assistance to 32 the commission; and 33 4.
