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1 Resolved: That the commission shall consist of 15 members, as follows: 2 Two Senators appointed by the 3 President of the Senate; 2 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House; 3 representatives of organized labor, one appointed by the President of the 4 5 6 Senate, one appointed by the Speaker of the House and 7 one appointed by the Governor; 3 representatives of health care management, one appointed by the President 8 9 the Senate, one appointed by the Speaker of the 10 House and one appointed by the Governor; and general public 11 member the appointed of by 12 The Commissioner of Labor or his designee, Governor. 13 the Commissioner of Human Services or his designee, the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services 14 15 or his designee and the Chairman of the Maine Health 16 Care Finance Commission or his designee shall serve in 17 an advisory, nonvoting capacity. The commission shall 18 select a chairman from among its members. Chairman of the Legislative Council shall convene the 19 20 first meeting, which shall take place no later than 30 21 days after the effective calendar date of 22 resolve. Legislative members of the commission shall receive per diem compensation and other voting members 23 24 of the commission shall be compensated for The commission may organize subcommittees 25 to investigate specific areas of study and may hold hearings in the course of its study; and be it further 26 27

Study. Resolved: That the commission shall undertake a complete study of the status of the nursing and health care professions, with particular emphasis on the causes of the current staff shortage and its impact on the delivery of quality health care in the State. In the course of its study, the commission shall:

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- Evaluate the difficulties cited by hospitals, nursing homes and other health care institutions, both public and private, to attract, retain and recruit health care professionals;

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this resolve is to establish the Commission to Study the Status of the Nursing and Health Care Professions in Maine, with particular emphasis on the current staffing crisis. commission will be charged with identifying the conditions and practices which contribute to the shortage of health care professionals and assess impact on the quality of health care delivery in urban, suburban and rural areas of Maine. The commission will submit its report to the First Regular of the ll4th Legislature, along recommendations to enhance Maine's ability to recruit, attract and reintegrate nursing and professionals to the industry.

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
