A, §78, is amended to read: The board shall consist of  $\pm\pm$  14 voting members and advisory members appointed as provided in this 16 17 section. For the purpose of this section, the word "designee" means a person in a major 18 19 person 20 policy-influencing position as defined in chapter 71. 21 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA \$1892, sub-\$1, ¶¶H and I, as 22 enacted by PL 1985, c. 785, Pt. A, §78, are amended to 23 read: 24 appointed by H. Two members the Governor 25 representing the remaining state agencies of State 26 Government; and 27 Ι. Two members, appointed by the Governor who are 28 administrators or managers of data processing 29 systems in the private sector ;

9 10 11	Sec. 4. 5 MRSA §1893, sub-§8, as amended by P.L. 1987, c. 534, Pt. A, §§6 and 19, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
12	8. Establish information and data exchange
13	procedures. The board shall propose a set of options
14	for an information and data exchange procedure by
15	January 15, 1989, by which information and data as
16	described in paragraph A shall be made available to
17	the Department of Economic and Community Development
18	and the State Planning Office. The Department of
19	Economic and Community Development and the State
20	Planning Office shall use the information for the
21	evaluation, monitoring and forecasting of economic
22	growth, for the promotion of economic and community
23	development and for the monitoring of poverty and
24	economic and social conditions throughout the State.
25	The confidentiality of any information provided to the
26	Department of Economic and Community Development and
27	the State Planning Office pursuant to this subsection
28	shall be maintained.
29 30	A. The data and information subject to the exchange procedure shall include:
31	(1) Employment data, including employment by
32	the Standard Industrial Classification Code
33	and by occupation;
34 35	(2) Wage data by the Standard Industrial Classification Code and by occupation;
36	(3) Income data, including personal and
37	business income;

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1	(4) Housing data, particularly data to
2	measure the extent of the availability of
3	affordable housing for low-income and
4	moderate-income households throughout the
5	State;
б	(5) Levels of education of the work force;
7	(6) Enrollments in secondary
8	vocational-regional centers and the
9	Vocational-Technical Institute System;
10 11 12	(7) Enrollments of Maine residents in colleges and universities located inside and outside the State;
13	(8) Job training, including participants and
14	types of programs;
15	(9) Business financing data;
16 17	(10) General assistance data, including state and municipal assistance;
18	(11) Business growth and change, including
19	business expansions, new businesses and
20	business closings;
21 22	(12) Changes in land use from an undeveloped status to a developed status;
23	(13) Investments in business in this State
24	which shall be differentiated in accordance
25	with the Standard Industrial Classification
26	Code;
27	(14) Business usage of electrical power,
28	differentiated according to Standard
29	Industrial Classification Code standards;
30	(15) Data by which employment and
31	unemployment patterns, poverty and low-income
32	patterns and economically distressed
33	communities and regions can be determined; and

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34(16) Taxation data maintained by the Bureau35of Taxation.

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1	B. In the event that there are any problems with
2	respect to the successful implementation of this
3	subsection, the board shall report these problems
4	to the joint standing committee of the Legislature
5	having jurisdiction over economic development.
6	The board shall cite the agency or agencies which
7	cannot make the information available to fill the
8	needs of the Department of Economic and Community
9	Development and the State Planning Office, any law
10	or rule that prevents or impedes the successful
11	implementation of this subsection and any other
12	reasons for the problems of implementing this
13	subsection.
14	C. The Department of Economic and Community
15	Development and the State Planning Office shall
16	report to the board and to the joint standing
17	committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
18	over economic development any problems that
19	prevent or impede the successful implementation of
20	this subsection and the reasons for these problems.
21	Sec. 5. 5 MRSA §1893, sub-§9 is enacted to read:
22	9. Report to the Legislature. The board shall
23	annually report its findings and recommendations with
24	respect to the provisions of subsection 8 to the joint
25	standing committee of the Legislature having
26	jurisdiction over economic development by the 3rd
27	Wednesday in January with the first report due in
28	1989. This report, at a minimum, shall contain the
29	following:
30 31	A. A description of the data and information that is available;
32	B. The format of the data and information,
33	including geographical units, in which the data is
34	collected or organized;
35 36 37	C. The extent to which the data is available on computer and a description of data that is recorded manually;
38	D. The age of the data;

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1 2	E. The frequency of maintenance and updating the data;
3 4	F. The extent to which the data can be organized by municipalities;
5 6 7 8	G. Alternatives for coordinating the data, including formats and compatibility, and the estimated dates by which these alternatives could be achieved;
9 10	H. The costs of the alternatives described in paragraph G; and
11 12 13	I. The means by which the users of this information may have ready and easy access to this information.
14	STATEMENT OF FACT
15	This amendment proposes the following changes:
16 17 18 19 20 21	1. The membership on the Information Services Policy Review Board is increased from 11 to 14 to include the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development, the Executive Director of the Maine State Housing Authority and the Executive Director of the Finance Authority of Maine;
22 23 24 25 26	2. By January 15, 1989, the board will develop a set of options for an information and data exchange procedure by which information and data are provided to the Department of Community and Economic Development and the State Planning Office; and
27 28 29	3. The Information Services Policy Review Board will report to the Joint Standing Committee on Economic Development with respect to:
30 31	A. The type of economic development data that is available;
32	B. The format of the data;
33 34	C. The age of the data and the frequency with which it is updated;

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D. The extent to which the data can be organized 1 2 by municipalities; 3 Ε. The alternatives and costs of these 4 alternatives for coordinating the data; F. The means by which users can obtain access to this information; and 5 ready 6 7 G.
