AN ACT to Facilitate the Collection and Organization of Data for Effective Use in State Government.

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and economic development organizations to generate and share data for economic development and planning purposes.

The State Data Coordinating Committee shall work closely with the Information Services Policy Board to collect and generate data and coordinate data collection of state agencies that are important to planning, evaluation, monitoring and forecasting of economic development and the understanding of economic and social change.

11 §13303. Definitions

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12 <u>As used in this chapter, unless the context</u> 13 <u>otherwise indicates, the following terms have the</u> 14 following meanings.

15 <u>1.</u> Committee. "Committee" means the State Data 16 Coordinating Committee.

Designee. "Designee" means a person in a major

20 The committee shall consist of ll voting members.

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E. Levels of education of the work force;

F. Enrollment in secondary vocational-regional Vocational-Technical Institute centers and the System;

Enrollments of Maine residents in colleges and universities located inside and outside the State;

Job training, including participants and types H. of programs;

29 I. Business financing data;

30 General assistance data, including state and J. 31 municipal assistance;

Business growth and change, including business 32 к. 33 expansions, new businesses and business closings;

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1 Changes in land use from an undeveloped status L. 2 to a developed status; 3 Investments in business in this State which shall be differentiated in accordance with the 4 Standard Industrial Classification Code; and :5 6 Business usage off electrical power, Ν. differentiated according to Standard Industrial 7 Classification Code standards. :8 9 4. Develop designated geographical units. The committee shall develop designated geographical units by which data shall be organized. The data shall be 10 11 12 organized by municipalities and by counties. 5. 13 Other organizational criteria. The committee 14 may develop other criteria by which may data be 15 organized. Adopt rules. The committee shall adopt rules 16 6.____ 17in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, chapter 375, for the collection, organization and 18 transfer of data and for the determination 19 and disposition of confidential data. 20 21 Confidentiality. The committee shall 7. establish standards by which confidential data shall be determined. In the event that confidential data is 22 23 24 required to evaluate any issue, conduct forecasting or to undertake planning, the confidential data shall be provided in accordance with rules established pursuant 25 26 27 to subsection 6. These rules shall not prohibit the 28 transfer or provision of confidential data, the 29 confidentiality of which shall be preserved the by 30 user. 31 §13306. 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may charge fees to persons and organizations outside State Government for these publications.

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7 <u>The committee shall determine the costs of</u> 8 <u>alternatives to implement this chapter. The committee</u> 9 <u>shall report its findings and recommendations to the</u> 10 <u>Governor and to the First Regular Session of the 114th</u> 11 <u>Legislature no later than December 30, 1988.</u>

12 §13308. Review of data

The committee, at least annually, shall review the 13 14 data collected pursuant to this chapter, the organization of the data and the process by which the data is collected and shared. The committee may 15 16 propose changes to the Governor and the Legislature 17 with respect to the collection, organization 18 and sharing of data. In the event that changes are made 19 20 in the organization of data, no changes may be 21 implemented that prevent the comparison and contrast 22 of data among the initially designated geographical 23 units over time.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is a product of the study of the Joint 25 26 Committee on Economic Development which Standing analyzed 14 regional economies throughout the State. 27 28 The committee found that data necessary for а 29 comprehensive understanding of regional economies was collected by many different agencies, each of which collected data for different geographical units. As a 30 31 32 result, it is extremely difficult, if not impossible 33 in many cases, to compare data among selected or 34 specified regions or geographical units.

35 This bill proposes to establish an interagency 36 data coordinating committee with the Director of the

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1 State Planning Office as chairman and 10 other 2 directors or commissioners of state agencies, the Deputy Commissioner of the Office of 3 including 4 Information Services. The purpose or mission for the 5 coordinating committee is to determine the means and costs by which data, collected by several different 6 7 agencies and necessary for economic development and planning, may be organized and easily adopted to any 8 9 designated geographical units.

10 The data shall be collected by municipalities and 11 by counties. The coordinating committee is also 12 required to develop a uniform format for the 13 collection of the data.

14 The coordinating committee shall report its 15 findings and recommendations, including costs and 16 implementing legislation to the First Regular Session 17 of the ll4th Legislature.

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
