4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine follows:	as
6 7	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §405, sub-§3, as enacted by 1983, c. 458, §1, is amended to read:	PL

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- 3. New hydroelectric dams. No person may develop new hydroelectric dams on the St. Croix River from Grand Falls to the north end of Wingdam Island without first:
- A. Having performed a feasibility study, by a qualified consultant, approved by the Governor to examine the alternative potentials for hydropower development downstream from Grand Falls and make having made the findings available to the State for review;
- 11 B. Having consulted with the office of the 12 Governor or other agency of the State, designated 13 by him, regarding the feasibility of this 14 downstream development; and
- 15 C. Having determined that there exists no 16 economically feasible site downstream from Grand 17 Falls:; and
- 18 <u>D. Having consulted with the St. Croix</u> 19 International Waterway Commission.
- In the event that the State disagrees with any of the assumptions, findings or conclusions of the economic feasibility study, the comments of the State shall be considered and responded to by the consultant. These comments and the responses of the consultant shall be noted in the final report of the economic feasibility

4. Review. This section shall be reviewed every your syears, and shall be repealed on January 1, 1988 1993, unless reenacted by the Legislature for an additional 5-year period. In the event that the St. Croix River is included in any legislative Act or regulation which directly or indirectly has as its effect the essential prohibition of construction of

new dams or development or redevelopment of existing dams on the St. Croix River, this section shall be repealed on the effective date of that Act or regulation.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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6 The St. Croix River was identified as one of the State's most outstanding river stretches in the Maine 7 8 Rivers Study and is granted special protection by the 9 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 405. provision expires on January 1, 1988, unless reenacted 10 11 by the Legislature for an additional 5-year period. 12 Also, in 1987, the St. Croix International Waterway 13 Commission was created to develop a plan to coordinate planning and management of the uses and resources of 14 15 the St. Croix River.

This bill extends the review period for an additional 5 years, to January 1, 1993. It also integrates new information which may be provided by the St. Croix International Waterway Commission whose purpose will be to coordinate planning and management of the uses and resources of the St. Croix River. New hydroelectric dams proposed in the section from Grand Falls to the north end of Wingdam Island on the St. Croix River must first be determined to be consistent with the commission's resource and recreational management plan for the St. Croix River.

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
