In the late 1970's, the Legislature implemented a program of taxation, in the form of the liquor tax, specifically to fund programs of treatment, education and prevention. In the years that have followed, a variety of programs of treatment, employee assistance and community education have been developed and implemented. Programs of education, primarily continuing education, have been developed for the most part by substance abuse treatment agencies. The universities and colleges of this State have participated on a limited basis in these programs and have occasionally sponsored summer institutes or workshops. However, programs designed specifically to train substance abuse counselors and employee
16 17 18	assistance coordinators have not been developed nor have there been consistent programs of continuing education for the substance abuse counselors presently
19 20	certified or for the other professionals in our State who are "treating" substance abuse.
21 22 23 24	This bill will provide funds for the first university-based program in Maine, a program which is very much needed by community agencies, providers and educators.
