2 §396-Q. Quarterly report

By September 15, 1988, and quarterly thereafter, the commission shall report to the Bureau of Taxation the amount of financial requirements for the most recently completed quarter of each hospital's payment year, determined by dividing the financial requirements for the applicable payment year by 4.'

9 Further amend the amendment in section 1, in that 10 part designated "§3174-E." in subsection 1, in the 5th 11 line (page 2, line 16 in amendment) by striking out 12 the following: "2 years" and inserting in its place 13 the following: '5 years'

STATEMENT OF FACT

3 The committee amendment takes advantage of federal options to extend Medicaid coverage to: Infants up to 4 one year of age and pregnant women, up to 100% poverty; children one to 4 years of age up to 100% poverty; and elderly and disabled, up to 100% of poverty; at a cost to the General Fund of \$1,845,107, 5 6 7 8 which \$1,600,000 will be raised through an 9 of assessment on hospitals, leaving only \$245,107 from 10 other General Fund revenues. 11

12 Representatives of hospitals, the Maine Health Care Finance Commission, payers and consumers have supported general funding of the program, but have agreed that funds for this option could be raised through an assessment on hospitals which would be 13 14 15 16 17 passed through to payers, but with a reconciliation to 18 pass through also to payers an equal or greater amount 19 of savings from reduced charity care expenses. The result is expected to be no increase in premiums 20 21 resulting from this option.

An assessment for one year of .002 of hospital financial requirements is projected to raise \$1,600,000. The program proposed is reasonably projected to result in payments to hospitals in excess of \$2,000,000. The assessment is sunsetted and includes a reconciliation to assure that the amount by which new payments to hospitals reduced charity care is "passed on" in decreased payment requirements to

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
