# FISCAL NOTE

This bill takes advantage of federal Medicaid options at a General Fund cost of \$2,613,408. Of this amount, \$1,600,000 in General Fund revenue will be raised through an assessment on hospitals and the remainder from deappropriations of surplus general funds from various accounts in the Department of Human Services. The General Fund appropriation will generate \$5,238,668 in federal matching funds.'

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment extends Medicaid coverage to pregnant women and infants up to 185% of poverty, children ages one to 4 and elderly and disabled, effective October 1, 1988. The amendment deappropriates funds no longer needed to fund the prenatal program and appropriates funds for additional eligibility staff; \$1,600,000 of the state funds is

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raised through a one-time assessment on hospitals which will be passed through to payors and set off by the reduction in charity care that they will receive from the \$2,500,000 to \$3,000,000 in Medicaid payments to hospitals projected under this program.
