Penobscot Indian 25 Reservation. "Penobscot 8. Indian Reservation" means the islands in the Penobscot 26 River reserved to the Penobscot Nation by agreement 27 28 with the States of Massachusetts and Maine consisting 29 solely of Indian Island, also known as Old Town all 30 Island, and islands in said that river 31 thereof that existed on June northward 29, 1818, 32 excepting any island transferred to a person or entity 33 other than a member of the Penobscot Nation subsequent 34 to June 29, 1818, and prior to the effective date of If any land within Nicatow Island is 35 this Act. 36 hereafter acquired by the Penobscot Nation, or the 37 secretary on its behalf, that land shall be included 12.20 38 within the Penobscot Indian Reservation.

The. "Penobscot Indian Reservation" includes the following parcels of land which have been or may be acquired by the Penobscot Nation from Bangor Pacific Hydro Associates as compensation for flowage of reservation lands by the West Enfield dam: A parcel located on the Mattagamon Gate Road and on the East Branch of the Penobscot River in T.6 R.8 WELS, which is a portion of the "Mattagamon Lake Dam Lot" and has area of approximately 24.3 acres, and Smith Island an the Penobscot River, which has in an area of approximately one acre.

12 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Over the last several years, Bangor-Hydro Electric Company, through Bangor Pacific Hydro Associates, has been improving and rebuilding its dam in the Penobscot River between West Enfield and Howland. The dam has been raised and will impound more water. As a result of this, it is estimated that about 24 to 25 acres of Penobscot Reservation land, consisting of islands in in the Penobscot River, will be flooded. Bangor Pacific Hydro Associates and the Penobscot Nation have worked out an agreement providing for compensation to the Penobscot Nation which includes land to replace the flooded reservation lands. Bangor Pacific Hydro Associates has agreed to provide land along the East Branch of the Penobscot River and a small island in the Main Stem of the Penobscot River which total approximately the same acreage as the land which will be flooded. This bill prevents the area of the Penobscot Reservation from being diminished bÿ providing Penobscot Indian that the Reservation includes these replacement lands. Its passage will make it unnecessary for the Penobscot Reservation land to be taken by eminent domain.
