12 STATEMENT OF FACT

On May 13, 1986, Kenneth Demuth volunteered to assist 3 State Police officers who were trying to persuade Ken Mitchell, an individual who had been firing live ammunition at passersby the day before and who on the morning of May 13, 1986, was standing in his house with a rifle, to surrender. As Mr. Demuth attempted to talk to Mr. Mitchell, he was shot in the face by Mr. Mitchell at approximately 10:00 a.m. Kenneth and Janice Demuth allege that the negligence of the State and its employees in failing to take appropriate steps to protect Mr. Demuth was the proximate cause of Kenneth Demuth's injuries and the resulting injury to Janice Demuth.

The Demuths are authorized by law to bring an action against the state employees involved; recovery against the individual state employees for their alleged negligence, however, is limited to \$10,000 each. Because of the unique circumstances of this case and because the State Police accepted the assistance Kenneth Demuth volunteered to render, the Legislature feels that the State has a moral obligation to compensate Kenneth and Janice Demuth directly for their injuries. It is in the best interest of the State and the Demuths to avoid

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- expensive and protracted litigation in this matter. Settlement of \$125,000 is fair and reasonable, given the extent of Mr. Demuth's injuries, namely, the total loss of an eye and his psychological damage and given 3 the potential liability exposure of state employees and the State if a bill to authorize waiver of sovereign immunity were passed. Accordingly, this amendment authorizes and directs, upon receipt of 5 6 7 9 necessary releases, the Governor to pay the Demuths a 10 sum of \$125,000. The payment authorized by this 11 amendment is in full satisfaction of any claims which 12 Kenneth and Janet Demuth may have against the State of Maine and its employees for the injuries sustained by Mr. Demuth on May 13, 1986. The Demuths will assume payment of all their legal costs. 13 14 15
- This amendment also appropriates the funds to pay for the settlement.
