Kenneth Demuth was shot in the face on the morning 4 of May 13, 1986, at approximately 10 A.M. Mr. Demuth 5 was assisting the Maine State Police in trying to talk to Ken Mitchell, a neighbor who had been shooting at passersby the day before. Apparently, Mitchell, a war б 7 8 veteran being treated by the Veterans Administration, failed to take his medication. Mr. Demuth was afraid 10 that Mr. Mitchell might shoot at the school bus, and therefore agreed to help the police when he was asked. Mr. Demuth drew them a map of the roads in the area and helped to put snipers in position. Mr. Demuth was given a bullhorn to talk to Mr. Mitchell, and attempted to "talk him out" as he was afraid the 13 14 15 police might be forced to injure Mr. Mitchell.

17 As Mr. Demuth attempted to talk to Mr. Mitchell, 18 Mr. Demuth was shot by Mitchell. The bullet struck Mr. Demuth lost his right eye and 19 his right eye. suffered scarring and emotional trauma from such 20 21 tragic and gruesome injury. Janice Demuth has 22 suffered and will continue to suffer a 23 consortium.

Kenneth and Janice Demuth allege that the negligence of the State and its employees in failing to take steps to protect him was the proximate cause of Kenneth Demuth's injury.

This action, if authorized, is to be brought in 28 29 the Superior Court of Knox County, within one year from the passage of this resolve, against the State 30 31 and its employees for damages, if any. The action and the conduct of it shall be according to the practice 32 33 of actions or proceedings between parties in 34 A. Superior Court. % The diabilities of the parties and elements of damage, if any, shall 35 be the same as liabilities of 🚎 damage 36 and elements between 37 individuals. The complaint issuing out of the Superior Court under the authority of this resolve 38 shall be served on the Secretary of State by attested copy by the sheriff or his deputies in any county of 39 40 41 the State. The Attorney General is authorized and

designated to appear, answer and defend this action and none of the statutory limits of recovery or immunities existing pursuant to the provisions in the 2 3 4 Maine Tort Claims Act shall apply. The Attorney General or his designee is further authorized to enter into a compromised settlement, if agreed to by the parties, which shall be binding on the State. 5 6

Any judgment that may be recovered in this civil action shall be payable from the State Treasury on 8 9 10 final process issued by the Superior Court and costs 11 may be taxed for Kenneth and Janice Demuth if they recover in this action. Their recovery shall not exceed \$300,000, including costs. A hearing shall be 12 13 14 before a Justice of the Superior Court, with or 15 without a jury. The Justice shall be the regularly scheduled Justice presiding in 16 the Knox County Superior Court when this matter is scheduled for trial. 17

18 STATEMENT OF FACT

for the Mr. Demuth worked State of Maine, Department of Corrections, at the Maine State Prison for 12 years. While at the prison, he was nicknamed "The Bear" because of his courageous confrontations of hostile inmates and his ability to defuse explosive situations. He was a trusted and valuable employee of State and law enforcement offices until his retirement in 1984 because of 2 heart attacks suffered while working at the prison.

Kenneth Demuth was shot in the face on the morning of May 13, 1986, at approximately 10 A.M.. Kenneth and Janice Demuth allege that the negligence of the Kenneth State and its employees in failing to take steps to protect him was the proximate cause of Kenneth Demuth's injury.

resolve is being introduced because This statutory limits for recovery imposed by the Maine Tort Claims Act, \$10,000 for each incident, are inadequate to compensate Kenneth and Janice Demuth for the personal injury to Kenneth Demuth.
