AN ACT to Amend the Fisheries and Wildlife Work Education Program.								
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4 the נק ;y 5 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days б after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it is imperative that our secondary students learn about wildlife and wildlife management; 8 and

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1 Whereas, the youth fisheries and wildlife 2 conservation education program in the Department of 3 Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is a successful program; 4 and

5 Whereas, there are numerous sporting clubs that 6 would like to sponsor additional students to 7 participate in the program at no cost to the State; 8 and

9 Whereas, the legislation allowing them to sponsor 10 students must be in effect before the department 11 selects students and begins planning for the coming 12 summer; and

13 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 14 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 15 Constitution of Maine and require the following immediately 16 legislation as necessary for the 17 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 18 now, therefore,

19 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 20 follows:

21 Sec. 1. P&SL 1987, c. 12, §1 is amended to read:

22 1. Pilot program. Sec. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife 23 with support and 24 assistance of the Department of Conservation's SERVE Maine Program shall conduct a pilot program for secondary high school students to increase student awareness and understanding of fisheries and wildlife 25 26 27 management principles and practices. 28

Ten Up to 25 secondary school students shall be selected annually to assist specific inland fisheries and wildlife and conservation law enforcement projects 29 30 31 32 being undertaken by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. Ten students shall be funded by the department each year and up to 15 students may be 33 34 35 sponsored by individual sporting organizations. The 36 program shall be for a 6-week to 8-week period during 37 the summer recess.

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To be eligible, the students must be between the ages of 15 and 18 years, enrolled in the freshman through junior years in a secondary school in the State and possess a Maine driver's license and be capable of providing their own transportation to the site of the project which they are assigned, unless public transportation is available. <u>In addition,</u> students sponsored by individual sporting groups may be required to meet the requirements of those groups.

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Sec. 2. P&SL 1987, c. 12, §3 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 3. Application procedures. Interested 12 students shall apply for acceptance into department 13 sponsorship in the program on a form provided by the department or the SERVE Maine Program and in the 14 15 manner prescribed on the application. The application 16 shall be accompanied by a one-page statement prepared 17 by the applicant which summarizes their particular 18 interest in fisheries and wildlife conservation and 19 why they want to be accepted into the program.

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Sec. 3. P&SL 1987, c. 12, §4 is amended to read:

21 Applicant selection. The department Sec. 4. 22 shall evaluate each application, the applicant's 23 interest in inland fisheries and wildlife and their 24 reasons for applying to the program. Ten applicants shall be selected to be funded in the program by the department on the basis of the information presented 25 26 27 by each applicant to work on specific Department of 28 Inland Fisheries and Wildlife projects which best 29 match the interests and desires of the applicants and 30 the department's ongoing work programs. The legal 31 the selected applicants <u>sponsored</u> residence of by 32 the department shall be geographically distributed 33 across the State. Students Department-sponsored 34 students shall not be selected from the same school in 35 succeeding years.

36 **Sec. 4.** P&SL 1987, c. 12, §4-A is enacted to 37 read:

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1 Sec. 4-A. Private club sponsorship. Individual sporting clubs shall advise the department as to how 2 3 their club will select students. They shall 4 incorporate guidelines developed by the department. 5 Sec. 5. P&SL 1987, c. 12, §6 is amended to read: Compensation. Each student shall be 6 Sec. 6. covered by the SERVE Maine Program and compensated in accordance with the provisions of that program with 7 8 money derived from the Department of Inland Fisheries 9 10 and Wildlife or from individual sporting groups. Sec. 6. P&SL 1987, c. 12, §7-A is enacted to 11 12 read: 13 Sec. 7-A. Allocation. In view of the emergency 25 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 26 approved. 27 FISCAL NOTE 28 This bill will result in an increase in dedicated revenue to the Department of Conservation, the Maine 29 Conservation Corps Fund, in the amount of \$15,000 for 30

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fiscal year 1988-89. This revenue will be derived from anticipated individual donations from sporting organizations.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

5 The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife 6 successfully developed a program to expose high has 7 school students to the principles and theories behind wildlife management. There are many sporting clubs in 8 the State that support the concept of this program. 9 10 This bill expands the youth fisheries and wildlife conservation education program by allowing individual sporting clubs and organizations to sponsor additional students. It allows the department to increase the 11 12 13 14 size of the program by an additional 15 students at no additional cost to the State. 15

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
