AN ACT to Extend the Reporting Deadlines of Certain Commissions and Committees.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, current law requires the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources to review and report to

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1 the Legislature on the 2-inch clam law by March 1, 2 1988; and

3 Whereas, the Department of Marine Resources has 4 been accumulating data relating to the advisability of 5 the law which will not be available to the Joint 6 Standing Committee on Marine Resources until March 7 l2th, but which is necessary for the committee to 8 assess accurately the success of the law; and

9 Whereas, Resolve 1987, chapter 52, created the
10 9-1-1 Study Commission which was required to submit a
11 report which would aid the Joint Standing Committee on
12 Utilities in drafting legislation to be submitted by
13 January 30, 1988; and

14 Whereas, the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities, having received an initial report from the 15 9-1-1 Study Commission which did not include necessary 16 17 cost information only recently made available to the commission, needs additional time to consider 18 the 19 and cost information before introducing report 20 legislation relating to this important issue; and

21 Whereas, Resolve 1987, chapter 64, created the 22 Special Commission to Study School Entrance Age and 23 Preschool Services and mandated that the commission 24 report by March 1, 1988; and

25 Whereas, the Special Commission to Study School 26 Entrance Age and Preschool Services, having met times in 1987 and 1988 and having held 3public 27 hearings to receive public input as directed by its 28 29 authorizing legislation, needs additional time to 30 complete its study; and

31 Whereas, Public Law 1987, chapter 542, created a 32 Commission on the Feasibility of Constructing a 33 Highway to the St. John Valley and mandated that the 34 commission shall report its findings and any necessary 35 legislation by February 15, 1988; and

36 Whereas, the Commission on the Feasibility of 37 Constructing a Highway to the St. John Valley was 38 charged with an extensive and complex issue with far-

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1 reaching economic ramifications, and needs additional 2 time to complete the study and submit its findings and 3 legislation; and

Whereas, the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee must have an extension of its statutory annual reporting deadline in order to adequately complete its duties; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 8 9 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 10 Constitution of Maine and require the following immediately necessary 11 legislation as for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 12 13 now, therefore,

14 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 15 follows:

16 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6681, sub-§7, as enacted by PL
17 1983, c. 838, §6, is amended to read:

This section shall be reviewed by the Sun<u>set.</u> 18 7. 19 joint standing committee of the Legislature having 20 jurisdiction over marine resources in the Second (21 Regular Session of the ll3th Legislature. That 22 later than committee shall report its findings no 23 March April 1, 1988.

Sec. 2. PL 1987, c. 542, §2 is amended to read:

Feasibility of highway. 26 commission shall study the feasibility of constructing a 4-lane highway, with controlled access, from the end 27 of the existing Interstate 95 to the St. John Valley. 28 conduct an 29 The commission may impact study if. 30 necessary. 34 Sec. 3. Resolve 1987, chapter 52, 12th ¶ is 35 amended to read:

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Report. Resolved: That the commission shall

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present its findings, together with any recommended legislation on or before December 1, 1987, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over public utilities, which shall review the report and submit any recommended legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature, by January-30 February 29, 1988; and be it further

8 Sec. 4. Resolves 1987, chapter 64, section 3, 9 first sentence is amended to read:

10 That the special commission shall issue its report, 11 including any proposed legislative recommendations, to 12 the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature no 13 later than March April 1, 1988.

14 Sec. 5. Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning 15 report extension. Notwithstanding the Committee; Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 7132, subsection 2, paragraph A, the annual report by the 16 17 Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee shall be 18 submitted to the Legislature by February 29, 1988. 19

20 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency 21 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 22 approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT
