#### STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

#### RESOLVE, to Create a Demonstration Project to Provide for Ladders of Advancement in the Nursing Profession.

5 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves 6 of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 7 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; 8 and

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1 Whereas, the State is currently experiencing a 2 severe problem of nursing availability to meet the 3 needs for health care services in the community; and

4 Whereas, the provision of a program to allow for 5 ladders of advancement within the nursing profession 6 would act as an incentive for the recruitment and 7 retention of nursing personnel; and

8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 9 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 10 Constitution of Maine and require the following 11 legislation as immediately necessary for the 12 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 13 now, therefore, be it

14 Demonstration project. Resolved: That а 15 demonstration project to provide for ladders of advancement in the nursing profession shall 16 be 17 conducted between the Lewiston-Auburn area long-term 18 care facilities and the Central Maine 19 Vocational-Technical Institute.

20 This project provides funds for 16 students to 21 receive college credit for the completion of their 22 certified nursing assistant certificate and the 23 continuation of their nursing training.

Each student is eligible to receive a maximum of college credits over the one-year duration of this project.

Each student shall receive a reduced tuition based
on the continuation of acceptable employment in one of
the area's long-term care facilities; and be it further

That Results of Resolved: the results of this project shall be published in a final 31 32 report to be submitted to the First Regular Session of 33 the 114th Legislature by February 1, 1989. This report shall also be made available to appropriate 34 35 state agencies and the State's health care facilities.

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The report to the Legislature shall include

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recommendations of any changes to laws and rules which are necessary to implement this project on an ongoing statewide basis; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds be appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

#### 7 HUMAN SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF

#### All Other

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The funds may be made available through the Special Circumstances Allowance of the Department of Human Services. This appropriation is the maximum anticipated amount to be needed as an offset for tuition. Those students who do not continue employment in а long-term facility over the course of the project will receive tuition not reimbursement.

24 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 25 cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect 26 when approved.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

28 The State is currently experiencing a severe 29 problem of nursing availability to meet the needs for 30 health care services in the community. This resolve 31 creates a demonstration project to establish a 32 curriculum of certified nursing assistant training and

provides for ladders of advancement within the nursing 1 2 3 profession. This demonstration project will be developed between member nursing homes of the Maine 4 the Central Maine Health Care Association and 5 Vocational-Technical Institute. Results from the 6 project shall be reported to the joint standing 7 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 8 human resources. If the demonstration proves successful, it will be used as a model for a statewide 9 10 plan.

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
