In the 17 years after implementation of the Job Classification Program, minor adjustments have been made but no comprehensive review of the program was conducted. In July of 1983, a multi-party committee was convened to undertake such a review and to submit recommendations for the improvement of the Job Classification Program. All parties with an interest in the classification, including the university administration, the 3 unions where members hold positions covered by the program and university supervisors, have been represented on the University Job Classification Program Joint Study Committee.
