AN ACT to Allocate Stripper Well Oil Refund

5 6	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days			
7	after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and			
8 9	Whereas, the United States Congress, to achieve deficit reduction and in recognition of the			

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1 2 3	availability to states of oil refund money, has cut the State's allocation for the Home Energy Assistance Program by almost \$4,000,000; and
4 5 6 7	Whereas, the delay in the Federal Government action has caused no benefits to be paid yet and appointments for applications are now scheduled into March; and
8 9 10 11	Whereas, the average annual benefit in the Home Energy Assistance Program, due to federal cuts and increased numbers of low-income applicants, has decreased from \$420 in 1983 to \$311 in 1987; and
12 13 14 15	Whereas, the decrease in delay in Home Energy Assistance Program funds has put added demands on sources of emergency funds, including municipal general assistance; and
16 17 18	Whereas, several uses of stripper well overcharge funds proposed last year have been rejected by the United States Department of Energy; and
19 20 21 22 23 24	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
25 26	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
27 28 29	Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Stripper Well Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988, to carry out the purposes of this Act.

10 11 12 13 14 15	This bill allocates the money now in the Stripper Well Fund, due to the United States Department of Energy's rejection of the State's previous proposals concerning fuel assistance, to the Home Energy Assistance Program to make up federal budget cuts over the last several years.
