AN ACT to Develop a Program for Prenatal

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

Detection of Handicapping Conditions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §1534 is enacted to read:

Frenatal detection of handicapping conditions

Page 1-LR4634

1. Maternal serum alpha-fetoprotein screening

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2. Rulemaking. The department shall promulgate rules, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, to regulate the screening program under subsection 1, including, but not limited to, requirements for medical laboratories licensed by the department in accordance with chapter 411, article 3 and patient support services.

13 STATEMENT OF FACT

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The measurement of alpha-fetoprotein in a woman's blood during pregnancy is a screening method to detect bifida spina and other genetically related handicapping conditions. This bill establishes screening program to detect elevated levels alpha-fetoprotein to help prevent handicapping conditions, and authorizes the Department of Human Services to adopt rules to regulate the program and provide for patient support services.

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
