- 13 §2155. Training for entry-level health occupations
- Training for certified nurses aides, home health care aides and other similar occupations, including licensed practical nurses, shall be as follows.
- 17 <u>l. Training delivery. Training delivery is as</u> 18 follows.
- A. Job training services, which will be provided under the state job training system, shall be coordinated by the Department of Labor and the Department of Human Services job training programs. - 24 §2157. Payback loans for registered nurses
- 1. Plan established. A government student loan payback plan for registered nurses, up to the amount of funds appropriated by the Legislature for this purpose, is established. Any nursing home, hospital or other health care provider may pay for a registered nurse's government student loan used for nurses' training and be reimbursed for amounts paid out for 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 the loans according to the methods set forth in subsection 2. Reimbursement shall not exceed amounts 32 33 equal to the number of monthly payments of principal plus interest, based on a 10-year term of the loan, 34 35 which reflects the actual number of months of 36 37 employment at the institution.
- 38 Methods of repayment. Repayment of loans 39 shall be as follows.

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1	A. The Department of Human Services, by rule promulgated in accordance with the Maine

4 FISCAL NOTE

The \$100,000 appropriated to the Department of Labor also appears in the proposed supplemental budget bill, Legislative Document 2156, under the Department of Human Services, Health Occupational Training.

9 In addition to the appropriations and allocation outlined, the estimated cost to 3rd party and private payors totals \$409,730 in fiscal year 1989. Estimated cost of the program for the remaining 2 years is as follows:

19 Future cost estimates assume an increase of 90 new 20 nurses participating in the program each year.

It should also be noted that the bill requires hospitals participating in the training program to "bear those occupational training costs not covered by the Department of Labor." These amounts would also be added to the hospital's financial requirements by the Maine Health Care Finance Commission and would further increase hospital costs to all payors.'

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment makes several technical changes.
In addition, the program will be coordinated by the Department of Labor and the Department of Human Services instead of by the Private Industry Council. Certification for participants will be handled by the Department of Educational and Cultural Services rather than the institution giving the training. As in the original bill, hospitals are allowed to repay loans by

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- passing through these costs by adjustments by the Maine Health Care Finance Commission.
