10 11 Whereas, upcoming municipal elections provide the opportunity to remedy this deficiency if the authority's charter is suitably amended; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

- 12 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 13 follows:
- 14 Sec. 1. P&SL 1977, c. 14, §1, 3rd and 4th ¶¶
 15 are repealed and the following enacted in their place:
- 16 All 7 directors shall be residents of Eastport and 17 shall be elected by a majority of the legal voters voting at an election in the same manner and at the same time as Eastport city councilors for staggered terms of 4 years, provided that, at the next regular 18 19 20 or special election under this section, one director shall be elected for a term of one year, one for 2 21 22 23 years and one for 3 years. Directors shall begin their terms of office immediately following their 24 25 election.
- Vacancies that may occur by death, resignation or otherwise shall be filled by appointment by a majority of the directors of the authority then serving. Directors appointed in this manner shall serve until the next election of directors. A director elected to fill a seat vacated by death, resignation or otherwise shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- 33 Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date. In view of 34 the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall 35 take effect when approved only for the purpose of 36 permitting its submission to the legal voters of the 37 City of Eastport voting at the regular state election 38 in November 1988. The election shall be called,

advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections; provided that the registrar of voters of the city shall not be required to prepare for posting, nor the city clerk to post, a new list of voters and, for the purpose of registration of voters, the registrar shall be in session the 3 secular days next preceding the election, the first 2 days thereof to be devoted to registration of voters and the last day to enable the registrar to verify the correction of the lists and to complete and close up the records of the sessions. The city clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this Act to the following question:

"Shall the Charter of the Eastport Port Authority
be amended to require that all the directors be
residents of the City of Eastport and be elected
by the voters of the City of Eastport?"

The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

Upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election, this Act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof; provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act at the meeting equaled or exceeded 20% of the total number of votes cast for Governor in the city at the last gubernatorial election. Another election may be held, if the total number of votes cast in the first election does not equal or exceed 20%.

This Act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election. The result of the election shall be declared by the municipal officers of the City of Eastport and due certificate filed by the city clerk with the Secretary of State. Notwithstanding Private and Special Law 1977, chapter 14, section 1, as amended by this Act, the terms of any current directors of the authority no longer qualified for membership shall continue until the city election of the City of Eastport in December 1988.

For the purposes of this election only, candidates for membership on the Eastport Port Authority at the December 1988 election shall file nomination papers with the city clerk of the City of Eastport no later than November 23, 1988.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

The purpose of this bill is to make possible a 10 revision to 11 the charter of the Eastport 12 Authority. These proposed changes would still require 13 approval by the voters of Eastport. The bill revises the criteria for membership on the board of the Eastport Port Authority to ensure that all directors 14 15 16 of the authority are residents of Eastport. The bill also requires the directors to be elected "at large" with no ex officio members from city government to 17 18 19 keep separate the functions of the authority and city 20 The bill revises the method of appointing government. temporary directors to fill vacancies in a manner more consistent with normal corporate practices and revises 21 22 23 the terms of directors to reemphasize the original to maintain a staggered term structure. 24 intent Finally, the bill provides for ratification of the 25 26 amended charter by the voters of Eastport and provides 27 transition provisions for the selection of directors. A special provision is made for the filing 28 29 nomination papers for candidates for authority 30 membership. This one-time provision retains 31 current 15-day filing period following ratification of
