STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

RESOLVE, to Establish the Commission on State Standards for Personal Service Contracts.

Commission established; study. Resolved: That there is established the Commission on State Standards for Personal Service Contracts which shall conduct a study, including, but not limited to, the following:

1. The range of services which are provided by
 2 the State through purchased contractual services;

3 2. The standards which the departments, state 4 agencies or the State Purchasing Agent applies to 5 personal service contracts;

6 3. The extent to which personal service contracts 7 are subject to a competitive bidding process;

8 4. Whether such services should be more 9 appropriately provided by civil servants or private 10 contractors; and

11 5. Whether standards for personal service 12 contracts need to be developed which consider cost 13 savings, relationship to state and industry pay rates and benefits, displacement of civil service employees, 14 15 employee qualifications, affirmative action efforts, economic risks to the State, competitive bidding and any other factors which affect the integrity of the 16 17 18 civil service system and the public interest; and be 19 it further

20 appointment. Resolved: Membership; That the 21 commission shall consist of 12 members, as follows: Five members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House and 3 Senators 22 23 24 to be appointed by the President of the Senate, all of 25 whom shall be or have been members of the Joint Standing Committee on Audit and Program Review; one member representing the American Federation of State, 26 27 28 Municipal Employees; one County and member 29 representing the Maine State Employees Association; 30 and 2 members who are state employees responsible for 31 administration of state personal service contracts to 32 be appointed by the Governor. The appointing 33 authorities shall make the appointments within 30 days 34 of the effective date of this resolve and shall notify 35 Legislative Council in writing of the their 36 selections. The Chairman of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of the commission and the 37 38 commission shall select a chairman from among its 39 members; and be it further

Findings. Resolved: That the commission shall present its findings in a report in accordance with the Joint Rules, together with any necessary recommended implementing legislation, to the First Regular Session of the ll4th Legislature; and be it further

7 Compensation. Resolved: That legislative of the commission shall 8 members receive the 9 legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission meetings. If the commission meets on a 10 11 12 day when the Legislature is in session, legislative members shall receive only one legislative per diem on 13 14 that day, but may be reimbursed for all necessary 15 expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further 16

17 Resolved: That commission Staff. the may 18 request staff assistance from the Legislative 19 Council. All agencies and departments of State Government shall cooperate with the commission 20 and shall expeditiously provide the commission with 21 the 22 information and materials that it needs to carry out 23 the purposes of this order; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
