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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 897, L.D. 2326,  
Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify the Site Location of  
Development Law."

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Amend the Bill in section 1 by striking out all of  
subsection 2 and inserting in its place the following:

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'2. Traffic movement. The developer has made  
adequate provision for traffic movement of all types  
into, out of or within the development area. The  
board shall consider traffic movement both on-site and  
off-site. Before issuing a permit, the board shall  
determine that any traffic increase attributable to  
the proposed development will not result in  
unreasonable congestion or unsafe conditions on a road  
in the vicinity of the proposed development;'

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Further amend the Bill by striking out all of  
section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

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**'Sec. 2. Report; rules.** The board shall adopt  
rules governing the traffic criteria of the Site  
Location of Development Law by January 15, 1989. The  
Commissioner of Environmental Protection shall submit  
the rules to the joint standing committee of the  
Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources  
for review by January 15, 1989. At the time of  
submission, the commissioner shall report to the  
committee on efforts to revise the traffic criteria of  
the Site Location of Development Law.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 897, L.D. 2326

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2           The purpose of this amendment is to further  
3 clarify the existing traffic movement criteria of the  
4 Site Location of Development Law. The Commissioner of  
5 Environmental Protection is directed to adopt new  
6 rules for implementation of this traffic criteria and  
7 to report to the joint standing committee of the  
8 Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and  
9 natural resources by January 15, 1989.
