- 9 5. Rules. Adopt rules to carry out the purpose of this chapter, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, chapter 375, subchapter II;
- 6. Appearance. Appear in court and before other administrative bodies;
- 7. Notices and forms. Require the posting of notices or other adoption of forms by businesses subject to this chapter, to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
- 8. Publications. Issue such publications and such results of investigations and research as in its judgment will tend to promote independent living;
- 9. Reports. At least each biennium, report to the Legislature and the Governor describing the current issues related to independent living and make recommendations for any further legislation or executive action concerning independent living; and

 28 the other subchapters and everything reasonably
 29 necessary to perform its duties under this chapter.

If a consolidation or recodification of Title 25 and other laws is warranted, the commission shall submit its recommendations and appropriate enabling legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature by January 15, 1990.
 - Sec. 9. Personal care assistants; wages, benefits and overnight pay. The Bureau of Rehabilitation, in establishing and administering a program of personal care assistance services for severely disabled adults, shall expand its present program to serve an additional 20 new consumers and shall provide through contract with providers of in-home personal care assistance for an average compensation rate of \$7 an hour for personal care assistants, payment of \$12 each night for each client to overnight attendants and the establishment of a pro rata group benefits package, not to exceed \$1,000 for each personal care attendant, including health insurance, vacation and sick leave for personal care assistants. In overseeing the use of funds for increased wages of personal care assistance workers, the Bureau of Rehabilitation shall take into account regional variations in the cost of living and competitive wage rates across the State.
