For the first 12 months, no individual or family receiving extended medical assistance under this section whose gross monthly income is less than 150% of the federal poverty level may be required to pay any premium charge, deductible, coinsurance, copayment or similar charge for such assistance.

Individuals or families with gross monthly income of 150% or more of the federal poverty level shall pay a monthly premium for such assistance in accordance with the following schedule:

Income Premium Charge

150% to 159% of poverty level	1% of gross monthly income
160% to 169% of poverty level	2% of gross monthly income
170% to 179% of poverty Level	3% of gross monthly income
180% to 189% of poverty level	4% of gross monthly income
190% to 199% of poverty level	5% of gross monthly income

Individuals or families with gross monthly income equalling 200% or more of the poverty level shall be ineligible for extended medical assistance under this section.

B. For the 6 months following the first 12 months of receipt of extended medical assistance, no individual or family whose gross monthly income is less than 100% of the federal poverty level may be

bill would require a General appropriation to the Department of Human Services in the amounts of \$868,350 in fiscal year 1989 to extend medical benefits to Aid to Familes with Dependent Children and other eligible clients, effective January This cost is based on providing coverage for an estimated 847 people at an average cost of \$175 per month. The potential future cost for fiscal year 1990 this program will be approximately \$4,000,000. Governor's contains The supplemental budget approximately \$700,000 for fiscal year 1989 for medical coverage for Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education, ASPIRE, participants.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment provides health insurance benefits 25 to former Medicaid recipients who are employed by insurance employers who do not provide health Benefits will terminate 18 months from the 28 benefits. month in which ineligibility for cash assistance begins. The program includes sliding scale fees to be 30 charged to recipients with earnings of 150% or more of the federal poverty level during the first 12 months 32 of assistance. 33

Medicaid-eligible recipients Former with gross monthly earnings of 150% or more of the federal level are poverty eligible for only a 12-month recipients Medicaid-eligible Former gross monthly incomes of less than 150% of the federal poverty level are eligible for an additional 6 months

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of health insurance benefits. Recipients with earnings in excess of 100% of the federal poverty level will pay premiums in accordance with a statutory sliding scale fee schedule for the 6 additional months of coverage.

The Department of Human Services, in cooperation with the Department of Economic and Community Development and the Department of Labor, will report to the Legislature with respect to the operation and impact of the program. This report will also describe the impact of the program on the Maine economy and the State's labor force. There is no intent to require the use of sophisticated and complex computer programs and economic models with respect to the study.
