Membership; appointment. Resolved: That the commission shall be comprised of the following

The Commissioner of Marine Resources, or the commissioner's designee, shall serve as an ex officio member. All appointments shall be made within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve. The members shall select a chairman, who shall appoint other officers as needed. The Chairman of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of the commission; and be it further
