STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Enable Additional Agencies to Participate under the Finance Authority of Maine Loan Program.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1100-N, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1985, c. 714, §39, is further amended to read:

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1 1. <u>Contracts.</u> The authority shall contract 2 with each community action agency who <u>a community</u> 3 <u>development corporation which</u> seeks to participate in 4 this program in order to organize a job-start program 5 within the region served by the community action 6 <u>agency that community development corporation</u>. The 7 contract shall provide as a minimum:

8 A. Each community action agency That each 9 community development corporation shall designate 10 a coordinator who shall be responsible for the 11 job-start program in that region;

12 The board of directors of a community action в. community development corporation a job-start advisory board which 13 agency shall 14 may appoint 15 . consist of a subcommittee of the board of 16 directors to review and make recommendations 17 concerning loan applications and offer other small businesses, which board 18 advice to shall 19 consist of 5 members who represent low income 20 of people and representatives knowledgeable 21 business and financial matters. Members of the 22 job-start advisory board shall serve for a 2-year 23 term and may be reappointed to successive terms;

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- community action 24 The agency community c. development corporation shall be responsible 25 for 26 at least 50% of the administrative costs of implementing the job-start program, which costs may be derived from direct financial support or 27 28 29 in-kind services, or both; and
- 30 D. The community action agency community 31 development corporation shall involve existing small business technical assistance and counseling 32 programs in their implementation of the job-start program and shall, to the maximum extent feasible, 33 34 35 contract or arrange for in-kind donation of 36 technical and counseling services to assist 37 job-start loan applicants.
- 38 Sec. 2. 10 MRSA \$1100-N, sub-\$2, ¶G, as enacted 39 by PL 1983, c. 856, \$4, is amended to read:

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G. Loan funds shall be made available by the authority for loan recommendations by community action agencies community development corporations on the basis of a formula that takes into consideration both the population served by the agency and the economic conditions of the region, as evidenced by unemployment statistics and per capita income; and

STATEMENT OF FACT

10 This bill extends the Finance Authority of Maine 11 Loan Program to agencies other than the community 12 action program agencies, for example, the regional 13 planning agencies, and will increase the availability 14 of such loans to small businesses.

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
