# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Pertaining to Radar Detectors.

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as

Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §1254-A is enacted to read:

§1254-A. Radar detectors prohibited

1. Violation. Except as provided in subsection

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- 2, any person who operates a motor vehicle equipped with a radar detector on a public way is guilty of a Class E crime. For purposes of this section a radar detector is a device designed to detect microwaves in that portion of the electromagnetic spectrum used by law enforcement officers to measure the speed of moto vehicles. The presence of a radar detector in or on a motor vehicle operated on a way is prima facie evidence of a violation of this section. In order to demonstrate violation of this section the State need not prove that the radar detector was in operating condition or being operated.
- 2. Exceptions. The following exceptions apply.
- A. No person is guilty of a violation of this section at a time when the radar detector is not readily accessible for use by the operator or any passenger of the motor vehicle.
- 18 B This section does not apply to motor vehicles
  19 used by law enforcement officers in the
  20 performance of their official duties.
- 21 3. Evidence. A radar detector may be taken by a law enforcement officer if needed as evidence of violation of this section and when no longer needed shall be returned to the person charged or, at that person's request and expense, mailed to an address specified by the person charged.
- 4. Signs. The Commissioner of Transportation shall erect signs, on all ways which enter this State from other jurisdictions, which warn motorists of the contents of this section.
- 31 Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are 32 allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the 33 purposes of this Act.

	11.	STATEMENT OF FACT
	12 13 14 15 16 17 18	This new draft prohibits the operation of a motor vehicle which is equipped with a radar detector, unless the radar detector is not readily accessible for use by the operator or passengers. For example, visitors traveling through Maine would not be in violation if their radar detectors were placed in the trunk.
	19 20 21	The detectors could be taken by law enforcement officers as evidence of the violation, but would have to be returned when no longer needed for that purpose.
	22 : 23 : 24 : 25 : 26 : 26 : 2	The new draft also directs the Commissioner of Transportation to erect signs at this State's border to warn incoming traffic of the contents of the law and allocates \$25,000 from the Highway Fund for the signs.

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
